



Member Spotlight

SHERRY THOMAS



This month we feature Sherry Thomas, our Daytime Book Club coordinator. Sherry has volunteered on the Oakleaf Board since 1990, serving on the Scholarship, Cookbook, Nominating, and Bake Sale committees, as well as Newsletter Editor and as our Retiree Representative.

Where is your hometown?

It is Lake Winnipesauke, home of one of the largest lakes in New Hampshire. I enjoyed an idyllic childhood skiing in my own backyard, skating on the lake, hiking local hills and mountains, and swimming and boating on the lake. It is a beautiful part of the country and we visit often. Where do you live in San Diego?

We now live in Spring Valley. Previously, we lived at NMCSD, when my husband was XO (now "Deputy Commander") and in Alpine where we could see the Coronado Bridge on a clear day. We have been in Spring Valley for about seven years and love being close to all the San Diego activities.

Tell us about your family (spouse and children, if any). Jack and I have three daughters. Kim lives in Sterling, VA with her husband Steve and three daughters (Kara 7, Samantha 4 and Riley 1). Wendy lives in Lusby, MD (near NAS Patuxent River) with her husband Tom and children (Katie 4 and Jack 1). Teri lives in San Diego with her dog, Roxie and cat, Isabella. Kim is a high school English teacher and Mary Kay Consultant. Wendy is a first-grade teacher. Both are now stay-at-home moms and love it. Teri recently began a job at Scripps Research Institute in North County as Executive Assistant to one of the research VPs. Kim and Steve are expecting our sixth grandchild in June. Are you employed, raising children, or busy with volunteer work? If so, what do you do? This is the first year since we came to San Diego in 1990 that I have not been on the Oakleaf Board so I am beginning to find other areas to volunteer. In February I will become a President's Club Ambassador with the San Diego Zoological Society. Otherwise I am a retired Registered Nurse, from Children's Hospital as of 2001, and spend a lot of my time organizing family photos on the computer and

making pictures for wall displays. I also help my husband care for our two canine "kids", Nikki and Kramer. They are two Newfoundland Dogs with very long coats and slobbery mouths. I also like to do special things to keep in touch with our young grandchildren.

What are your favorite hobbies?

I love working on the computer, working in the yard, spending time with my husband and the dogs and doing crafts. Recently I did wood burnings of name plaques for each grandchild's bedroom door. How long have you been a Navy spouse and where have you been stationed during that time?

I have been a Navy spouse for almost 40 years. We began our Navy life in Key West, Florida and then went to Chelsea Naval Hospital (across the river from Boston and now closed), NMC Portsmouth, Naval Hospital Camp Pendleton, Naval Hospital Jacksonville, Washington, DC, NMC San Diego and the Health Services Office, San Diego for Jack's last duty station. He retired in 1995 after 30 years of active duty. What is or was your favorite duty station and why? It is a tie between San Diego and Portsmouth. We love San Diego with its wonderful weather, fantastic activities for both outdoor and cultural tastes and the "small city" atmosphere. Portsmouth was the place where I was very involved in the lives of my girls from PTA and Girl Scouts to being President of the Wives Club and serving on the Board for almost all of my 12 years there. It was a very special time in our lives. Tell us about your spouse. What does he do? My spouse is Jackson W. Thomas, originally from Wellesley, Massachusetts. He graduated from Bowdoin College in Bangor, Maine, received his medical degree from Tufts University School of Medicine and did his internship and Pediatric Residency at Tufts New England Medical Center, Boston Floating Hospital for Infants and Children. He was what was called a "Berry Planner" (drafted into the military but allowed to finish his specialty training before entering active duty, during the Vietnam War). We met at "The Floating" and entered the Navy on July 10, 1964. The majority of Jack's service was as a Pediatrician in Key West, Chelsea and Portsmouth. In Portsmouth he was Chief of Pediatrics from 1979-1984. In 1984 he joined the IG Team in Washington, DC for a year of travel and in 1985 we moved to Camp Pendleton where he was XO. In 1986 we moved across the country again so Jack could become CO of Naval Hospital Jacksonville. 1987 found us on the road to Washington, DC to serve another tour on the IG Team and also serve on various special groups at the will of the Surgeon General. In 1990, we returned to California where Jack served as XO of NMCSD for 3 years and then to the HSO. After retirement, Jack volunteered as an aide at the Hardy School in San Diego and became a reading coach. Now he is a volunteer with the CRES Program at the San Diego Zoo. He is an observer at the Panda Exhibit two days a week and also enjoys music and the computer. His real love is, of course, our Newfoundland Dogs.
